

Intensive Behavioral Health Services starts on January 17, 2020

Intensive Behavioral Health Services (IBHS) will start its implementation on January 17, 2020. Magellan is working closely during this transition period with the Department of Human Services (DHS), our county partners, providers and other stakeholders to implement the required updates and changes that will impact current Behavioral Health Rehabilitation Services (BHRS) and Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) services.

Over the past several months, Magellan has hosted provider and stakeholder meetings to share the current information available and to answer any questions. Monthly provider workgroup meetings are scheduled for January, February and March with additional meetings being scheduled as needed. - Families should not experience any service disruption for current BHRS authorizations, and families should expect all BHRS/ABA providers to accept calls from families that are seeking IBHS services. If a parent has any concerns about services, they should contact their Magellan care manager immediately.
