Team Up Against Hunger in Bucks County and Montgomery County through December 16

Two special events on December 10 will include former NFL players and cheerleaders

Newtown, PA - [November 10, 2022] – Magellan Health, Inc. today announced that Magellan Behavioral Health of Pennsylvania, Inc. (Magellan), in collaboration with the Philadelphia Chapter of the NFL Alumni Association, Bucks County Behavioral Health/Developmental Programs, and Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services, is coordinating a Team Up Against Hunger food drive through December 16 with a goal of 5,000 pounds of donations collected. The beneficiaries for the food drive are the Bucks County Opportunity Council for all donations collected in Bucks County and the MontCo Anti-Hunger Network for all donations collected in Montgomery County. Magellan currently administers behavioral health benefits throughout Pennsylvania with HealthChoices contracts in Bucks, Cambria, Lehigh, Montgomery, and Northampton counties.

Donation suggestions for food and non-food items along with 13 drop off locations across both counties are outlined below, to include several police departments, local hospitals, health centers, and county/township administrative buildings that have graciously agreed to participate in this community effort to help local residents needing a helping hand. On December 10, this collaborative effort of organizations will host two special events to offer a Saturday drop off opportunity for food and non-food donations listed below. During these events on December 10 only, the general public and kids in particular have an opportunity to receive basic football and cheerleading skills training from former NFL players and cheerleaders. In addition, drive-thru drop offs of donations are encouraged, and will include volunteers assisting with box/donation collections from vehicles. NFL Alumni try hard to make a difference in caring for kids and caring for our communities. We pledge to 'Team Up Against Hunger' and make an impact that gives hope, joy, nourishment, and change."

Jim Leonard, CEO of Magellan Behavioral Health of Pennsylvania, commented, "We are so appreciative for this collaborative effort, and we look forward to impactful results across Bucks County and Montgomery County. It's also important to realize that efforts such as this food drive help to bring attention and donations during the winter months, but on a year-round basis there continues to be need for our neighbors.
