

# The 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Bucks-Mont Food Drive Continues Through June 13

Magellan Behavioral Health of Pennsylvania, in collaboration with Bucks County Behavioral Health/Developmental Programs, Bucks County Human Services Division, and Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services, is hosting the 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Bucks-Mont Food Drive from May 5 through June 13. The beneficiaries for the food drive are once again the [Bucks County Opportunity Council](#) for all donations collected in Bucks County and the [MontCo Anti-Hunger Network](#) for all donations collected in Montgomery County.

This year's food drive collection goal is 4,000 pounds of donations (The '24 food drive collected just over 2,700 pounds of donations) at the 16 drop off locations across both counties.
